"Be watchful! Be ready! You do not know when the time will come." (Mark 13:33)





Spiritual Nutrition

From Our November 2020 Council Meeting

I would like to talk a little bit about today's Gospel Reading; it seems especially appropriate for the times we're in, this whole COVID pandemic. In this Gospel, Jesus goes up the hill and looks over Jerusalem, and He weeps for the City. He put a lot of effort into bringing them up to speed, and they pretty much missed the boat, and He feels bad that they're not available or are not open to all that's He is trying to do for them. There is another story where Jesus weeps at the tomb off Lazarus; they are a couple of my favorite scripture stories because they really reflect the humanity of Jesus. In both cases, people are a little out of touch about what's going on.

At Lazarus' funeral, they believe that life has completely ended, and this experience over Jerusalem people are pretty much ignoring Jesus and not taking him serious, not accepting what's going on. There is reason for Jesus to give up on the people and go find somebody who's more receptive to him, but He doesn't do that. Despite all the pushback He gets, He stays with the people. He weeps for Lazarus, but He still raises him from the dead. He weeps for the people of Jerusalem, but He still goes to Calvary. He still makes the effort to stay faithful to them even though we don't always stay faithful to Jesus.

It's an important consideration and this whole COVID thing we're in right now, its easy to be distracted, easy to give up on Jesus, easy to say nothing's going to happen that's any good and ignore our faith when in fact its probably the time we need it the very most. And the good news is that Jesus never gives up on us, he always stays with us, he always stays faithful. He goes and holds up His end of the bargain no matter where we are. So there is a reason for hope, there is a reason to stay true to our faith in all of this and know that no matter what is happening, Jesus is always there. The good news is that we're not about to be abandoned, we're not about to be neglected even though in our own difficulties, we may want to give up ourselves. Its really a time for hope. We look at the scripture to see where Jesus has done so much for us, and we stand strong. Its not a problem. We're going to be okay. There is never a reason to doubt, but there is a reason to persevere through the difficulty.

So in the difficult COVID times, for the pandemic, for all the setbacks we have, we can still stand strong and be confident because we know that we have God on our side. We acknowledge this in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. AMEN

The More You Know

365 CLUB

In 1955, the State Council formed the California Columbian Charities, Inc., a separate charitable organization run by Brother Knights, dedicated to assisting our California Brothers in financial distress—this includes our Brothers' widows.

The 365 Club Program is the primary means of fundraising for California Columbian Charities, leveraging the first and foremost principle of our Order, Charity. The concept is simple; every California Knight is requested to donate one penny a day, or \$3.65 per year to Columbian Charities.

Our Council does this through the payment of our dues. Ever wonder why our dues are not rounded off to a dollar amount? It's because we, by Council Vote years ago, added an additional \$3.65 every year to provide for our contribution to the 365 Club.

The money raised by our Council is presented to California Columbian Charities each year at the State Convention. This is done during a ceremony called the Parade Of Grand Knights. Every Grand Knight (or his representative) form a long line procession and deliver a check of the monies raised. Councils are presented a ribbon, indicating participation, that can be attached to our Council Banner. Typically our Council gives \$1000 check on an annual basis.



The monies raised go to helping those in financial need. Since the beginning, over 2400 requests for assistance have been answered, giving over \$3,600,000 in financial relief, including to some of our own Council Brothers and a large sum to help those impacted by California Wildfires. But you would never know. The program is designed to limit distress to our Brothers, and typically only the Grand Knight and Financial Secretary are involved at the Council level.

The typical grants provided by Columbian Charities support those in serious financial distress due to unemployment, sickness, family medical and hospital bills and overdue rent, and losses due to fire, flood, or earthquake.


