

## FAITH IN ACTION

What is Faith In Action? Think of Faith In Action as the umbrella framework for all Knights of Columbus related activities and programs that we are called to do. Implemented over the past couple of years, it is an evolution of the Building the Domestic Church Program from 2015. Faith In Action distributes program activities into four important categories, a Call to Action to our FAITH, FAMILY, COMMUNITY, and LIFE.

Pope Francis invites "Christians, everywhere, at this very moment, to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ." Faith in Action extends that same invitation to Knights of Columbus members and their families. It is a renewed personal invitation to live out the calling of our faith, the call to service of our neighbors, and to answer the age-old question, "Am I my brother's keeper?"

Faith In Action is a realization of the changing needs of men in the twenty-first century. It seeks to balance all of our key priorities - Faith, Family, Community, and Life, and with the reduced number of categories, it allows our Council to focus on implementing faith-filled programs focused on quality, not quantity, with the underlying goal for men to lead their family in faith—not leave their family for service.

Faith In Action program activities are meant to inspire our Council to put our faith into action. As a Council, we may choose to conduct one or more of the programs in each of the categories (we usually choose more). We choose programs that will draw us closer to our faith, our families and communities, and defend life in all stages, and in all conditions. A well rounded council program will have activities in each of the four categories, Faith, Family, Community, and Life. In total there are 33 individual program activities. Obtaining 16 program credits will qualify our Council to earn the Columbian Award—a successful year! We get one credit for each activity; with an additional credit for each completed Featured Program. Refer to our Past Grand Knight's article in this Knight News edition to learn how we did last year—another successful year!





## Novena for the Cause of Life

For each day, reflect on the quote from Pope Francis, pray a decade of the rosary and conclude with St. John Paul II's pray

- Sunday, Oct. 4 "Even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor, are masterpieces of God's creation ...."
- Monday, Oct. 5 "Human life is sacred and inviolable, and the use of prenatal diagnosis for selective purposes must be strongly discouraged."
- Tuesday, Oct. 6 "It is God who gives life.
  Let us respect and love human life, especially vulnerable life in a mother's womb."
- Wednesday, Oct. 7 "Every child who, rather than being born, is condemned unjustly to being aborted, bears the face of Jesus Christ ...."
- Thursday, Oct. 8 "The Church cannot be expected to change her position on this question.... It is not 'progressive' to try to resolve problems by eliminating a human life."
- Friday, Oct. 9 "Our defense of the innocent unborn ... needs to be clear, firm and passionate, for at stake is the dignity of a human life ...."
- Saturday, Oct. 10 "Equally sacred ... are the lives of the poor, those already born, the destitute, the abandoned and the underprivileged, the vulnerable infirm and elderly ...."
- Sunday, Oct. 11 "All too often ... people do not accept the 'Gospel of Life' but let themselves be led by ideologies and ways of thinking that block life, that do not respect life ...."
- Monday, Oct. 12 "Unborn children are always to be welcomed; life is always to be protected and loved, from conception to its natural end."

## SPIRITUAL NUTRITION

### From Our September 2020 Council Meeting

#### Deacon Bill Beam

As Catholics, we have a long tradition of engagement in the political process as a means of putting our faith into action. We are called to bring the best of ourselves and our faith to the public square—and yet today, many shy away from such involvement because our national and local conversations are filled with vitriol and harsh language, often directed at people themselves. Sometimes that engagement requires making difficult moral decisions that impact our own lives and those of others.

"Conscience is not something that allows us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a mere "feeling" about what we should or should not do. Rather, conscience is the voice of God resounding in the human heart, revealing the truth to us and calling us to do what is good while shunning what is evil."

Our conscience can help guide the decisions we make. The Second Vatican Council guides us: "Always summoning [one] to love good and avoid evil, the voice of conscience can when necessary speak to [one's] heart more specifically: do this, shun that" (Gaudium et Spes 16).

The Church teaches that it is important to work continually on conscience formation so we can be prepared to make decisions whenever the opportunity arises. Some specific ideas to form your conscience are:

- 1. Begin by being open to the truth and what is right.
- 2. Study Sacred Scripture and the teaching of the Church.
- 3. Examine the facts and background information about various choices and be discerning in where we gather information.
- 4. Prayerfully reflect to discern the will of God (Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, no. 18).

Doing the work of forming our consciences can seem daunting. Fortunately, we have many church teachings that can help us in this important task. **Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship** is an important resource for U.S. Catholics and helps us prayerfully reflect on how we can apply Church teaching in our civic life.

When personal attacks replace honest debate, no one wins. This kind of attack, no matter the reason, only serves to further divide our communities. As Catholics, we must model a better way.

We are called to recognize that each one of us is a beloved child of God and to respond in love to that reality.

As we move towards November, recognize the human dignity of those with whom you disagree, treat others with respect, and rise above personal attacks.

My political viewpoints must be based upon the teachings in the Gospel and a <u>well formed conscience</u>, which involves prayer, conversation, study and listening. Stand up for your convictions and speak out when you witness language that disparages others' dignity, while also listening and seeking to understand others' experiences.

Be compassionate to those you encounter with a tone and posture which affirms that I honor the dignity of others and invites others to do the same. I will presume others' best intentions and listen to their stories with empathy. I will strive to understand before seeking to be understood.

### **About The Knights**

#### ID DRIVE (aka TOOTSIE ROLL DRIVE) and OC CHAPTER CHARITIES

The ID Drive is an annual fundraising event to support those with intellectual disabilities. Each year, Knights of Columbus Councils across the State of California hold out cans, after Mass, at grocery stores, and at special fundraisers, to raise money to Support Those with Intellectual Disabilities. We happily hand out Tootsie Rolls to all comers, regardless if they give or not, hoping for that return smile we often get.

The money we raise ends up with Orange County Chapter Charities, a charted non-profit organization, established in 1977 to help those with intellectual and physical disabilities and special needs. Chapter Charities's Directors are all Third Degree Brother Knights and act as the Bishop's managers who oversee the distribution of contributions, ensuring the money is spent for the purpose that is was collected. Directors are elected by the Orange County Chapter — Councils are represented on the Chapter by their appointed delegates. (Our Chapter Delegates are our Grand Knight, Deputy Grand Knight, and Financial Secretary. We have two alternates - Steve Bolton and Dan Kane.

## What is a Chapter?

Chapters are a subdivision within the Knights to provide and support services to councils in their area. The OC Chapter also takes on projects as directed by the Bishop of Orange and promotes participation in Chapter, State, and Supreme programs. Most states don't have or need Chapters.

Our mission began in 1976 when OC Chapter leadership met with Bishop Johnson, the first Bishop of Orange to seek his input for a project that the Knights could participate in. Bishop Johnson's idea was for the Knights to come up with service programs that would benefit the handicapped and shut-ins of the County that his Diocesan programs could not reach.

One of the earliest projects that the Chapter took on was to aid Columbian House, a respite care home for Intellectually Disabled clients, run by the Sisters of St. Louis. Money was raised thru various Council run charity focused activities. Deemed a success, the Bishops of Orange have charged the Knights of Orange County with continuing this work for the Intellectually Disabled up thru the present.

In 1985, State Deputy Frank Nigro took best practices from Knights in Illinois, who would stand in public places and hand out Tootsie Rolls to passers by while holding collection cans for charitable causes. ...Orange County, where it is used to this day, annually raising money for Chapter Charities to support organizations which provide for those with Intellectual Disabilities. Chapter Charities was chartered as a 501(c) in support of the idea that if donations could be made tax deductible, they would grow...

...And boy have they grown...since its beginnings in the 1970s when OC Chapter conducted a charity banquet raising \$2000 to last year when Orange County raised \$204,000, dwarfing the rest of the State. Our own Council 6020, raising \$12,000 last year, continually ranks in the top 5 in the entire State. The money collected in Orange County fully funds Camp ReCreation, a residential camp for adults and children with disabilities, and supports numerous activities such as the OC Chapter Day of Sharing, Trunk or Treat, and horse therapy organizations, including one here in Huntington Beach.

The ID Drive has become one of the Knights most important charities.

## Council Faith Director

The Faith Director is a relatively new position for the Knights of Columbus, stemming from the Order's relatively new program FAITH IN ACTION.

The Faith Director reports to the Program Director (that's our Deputy Grand Knight — more on that in a future month). The Faith Director is an appointed position and selected by the Grand Knight - it is not an elected office. The man appointed should be comfortable discussing and planning Faith formation activities for our Council, and developing close ties with other parish ministries to help advance the needs of the entire parish or in our case - parishes at the Pastor's direction. Some of the duties:

- \* Responsible for all Faith based council programs. The Faith In Action Program website lists and explains these programs. They include: Spiritual Reflection, RSVP (supporting Seminarians), Building the Domestic Church, Holy Hour, Into the Breach, Marian Prayer Program, Rosary, and Sacramental Gifts. - \* Collaborates with the Council Program Director to determine which Faith programs will be focused on by our Council during that Columbian year.
- \* Keeps records of the Council's Faith programs for reporting to Supreme and for completing RSVP refunds our Council gets a percentage of money back that we use to support Seminarians.
- \* In our Council, we work thru our two Church Directors (Dan Orozco @ St Vincent de Paul & Tony Fotia @ St. Bonaventure) to promote and support Faith programs in our parishes.


